# Climate: Living the 3rd industrial revolution in the digital age







### About the talk

The climate challenge is an opportunity for the creation of jobs and wealth, while inventing new modes of production, consumption, and new economic models (circular, functionality, decarbonized and collaborative economy). This revolution, based on the coupling of technologies and new forms of energy, is the awaited 3rd revolution. It involves everyone, including the profession and its clients.

The Carbon Assessments apply to some companies through laws and regulations, as do CO2 emission quotas and energy savings certificates. Others must invent new businesses, or adapt their businesses to the new constraints linked to the climate challenge, and plan specific training programs to address the new standards and clients (individuals or companies), etc.

France was chosen as the host country for the 21st international conference on the climate (COP21 / Paris Climat 2015) chaired by Laurent Fabius, which will be held from November 30 to December 11, 2015; but don't wait for this date, get acquainted with the subject as a CPA!

### Key points

- Being up to date and a forerunner of the 21st international conference on the climate (COP 21)
- Gaining familiarity with new economic models (circular economy, economy of functionality, etc.)
- Broadening the current missions and developing new ones: evaluation, overhaul of information collecting and processing systems, adaptation of accounting systems, search for financing, attestations, etc.

### Objectives

- Establishing the link between the stakes linked to the climate and the impacts on the economy, and thus on companies
- Being able to accompany clients in the observance of the regulations that apply to them (annual assessment of CO2 emissions for example), helping them to obtain aid (techniques, subsidies, etc.), orienting them in their changes of equipment, processes, or economic models, etc.

- Climate challenges faced by companies of all sizes and all business sectors and CPA firms
- Legal and regulatory obligations of companies in the fields of energy, the environment, etc. linked to the climate
- Tools to accompany companies in these new challenges (tool boxes, subsidies, thinking carried out by the Institutions)
